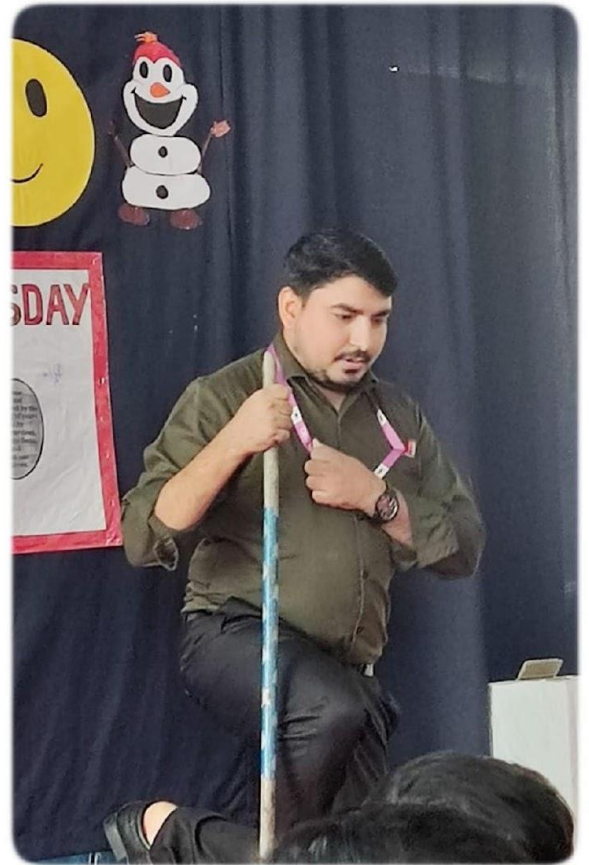
CHILDREN'S DAY
